

Writing Prompts

The Process: Each student starts with a blank piece of paper and pen. The teacher writes a story prompt on the white-board.

Chain Story:

This fun activity not only exercises students' understanding of writing structures, but engages them in some fun, creative collaboration too.

Each student spends two minutes, for example, using a writing prompt to kick start their writing. When they have completed this part of the task, they then pass their piece of paper to the student next to them. That student then continues the story from where the previous student left off for a given number of words, paragraphs, or length of time.

Sometimes it's fun to ensure students receive their own initial story back at the end for the writing of the story's conclusion.
